The Civil Rights Division is the principal federal agency committed to upholding civil and constitutional rights of all individuals, particularly some of the most vulnerable members of our society. The Division enforces federal statutes designed to protect the civil rights of all individuals and prohibit discrimination. The Professional Development Office (PDO) is responsible for providing training to Civil Rights Division attorneys in a number of areas, including electronic discovery, deposition skills, negotiations and investigation techniques. The PDO is staffed by career attorneys who have represented the Civil Rights Division in both criminal and civil cases. The PDO is seeking a student who is currently enrolled in an accredited law program and who has strong research and writing skills.

- Assist the Professional Development Office with legal research.
- Help to develop training materials.
